The Dean's Quarterly Report January – June 2013

General Overview: I am pleased to report that our common life continues to exhibit signs of health and promise (in both financial and pastoral terms). The thinking going on around issues to do with how we maximize our fixed assets, enhance the worship experience, whilst growing spiritually and serviceably is beginning to bear fruit. Highlights of this period were the Lenten series of meditations, 'You are the Clay'; the acquisition, unveiling and erection of the Stations of the Cross; the donation, installation and dedication of our new Organ and its artistic setting; the renovation of our Car park with its built-in security post; the renovation of the female lavatory; and the donation and use of our wireless Public Address system! The Executive Committee has worked extremely well in directing these efforts, and I am grateful for the support and prayers of you all.

Worship: the *music* ministry continues to challenge our best efforts. We have appointed Bro. Rex Agoi as our Assistant Organist. He comes to us with a wealth of skill and experience from St Stephen's Church. We expect him to provide assistance to the Organist, the Choir, and Praise Team as adequately as possible. I have been able to meet with all guilds at work during worship in order to enhance coordination and improve how we minister to the congregation.

Buildings and Grounds:

Windows: Our Windows project has three phases: art (images), glass smithing (staining glass), engineering(installing). It requires us to first acquire the artistic images we wish to mint into glass; secondly, have them minted into glass, and then lastly installed at Trinity. Completing the first phase is necessary in order to determine cost of windows. The first phase costs USD13,000. Unless we get the artwork done, we are unlikely to get quotations or estimates of cost per window.

Lights: we have begun exploring what will be required to set up the original lighting system of the Cathedral, according to the architectural design. We hope to report on progress at next meeting.

Car Park: By your generosity, and through God's grace, our car park is complete!
